Chukar-Soft hackles, wet tails (nymph and streamers), dry tails, wet hackle (nymphs and wet beards), paired quill wings (winged nymphs etc), dry wings (mayflies etc), salmon and steelhead built-wings (barred feathers), hen neck sub. (many uses), wing cases (nymphs), tented wings (streamers and dries like caddis flies), shellbacks (like a General Practitioner), salmon/steelhead veiling (when dyed), wet hackle (nymphs and beards on wets), wet cheeks (Cains' River style streamers and salmon/steelhead- often dyed), feather-sided bodies (tadpoles etc), spent wings (spinners), small tented wings (small spey-style shrimp and others, often hard to buy)

Quail- Soft hackle (full skins have neck feathers small enough for 18s and 20s-can't find soft hackles that small in most fly shops), wet wings (coachman), small tented wings (small spey-style shrimp and others, often hard to buy), wet legs (nymphs), antennae (dry and wet), wing cases (nymphs), spent wings (dries and spinners), salmon/steelhead veiling (when dyed), shellbacks (like a General Practitioner), dry feather wings (like mayflies etc), wet cheeks (Cains' River style streamers and salmon/steelhead- often dyed), feather-sided bodies (tadpoles etc)

Partridge-SOFT HACKLES (Full skins have neck feathers small enough for 18s and 20s-can't find soft hackles that small in most fly shops), sub for hen neck (many uses), wing cases, wet tails, dry tails, spent wings (spinners), dry wings (like mayflies etc), wet hackle (nymphs and beards on wets), nymph wings coachman), wet legs (nymphs), feather-sided bodies (tadpoles etc), tented wings, paired quill wings (wets), Voljch wings (feather glued to nylon-hopper wings etc), dry burnt wings, matuka wings, salmon/steelhead veiling (when dyed), shellbacks (like a GP), antennae (dry and wet)

Snipe-SOFT HACKLES, paired wings for wets, wet tails, dry tails, dry burnt wings, spent wings (spinners), dry wings (like mayflies etc),

salmon/steelhead veiling (when dyed), wet cheeks (Cains' River style streamers and salmon/steelhead- often dyed), feather-sided bodies (tadpoles etc), wet hackle (nymphs and beards on wets), antennae (dry and wet), tented wings (streamers and dries like caddis flies),

Sage Grouse-SOFT HACKLE, tails, legs, wing cases, dry burnt wings, paired quill wings, hackle wings, small biots, tented wings (streamers and dries like caddis flies), matuka wings, wet cheeks (Cains' River style streamers and salmon/steelhead- often dyed), feather-sided bodies (tadpoles etc), wet hackle (nymphs and beards on wets), antennae (dry and wet)

Ringneck-STAPLE, Dry wings, shellbacks (like a GP), claws (crawfish/crab imitations), eyes (shrimp, and crustaceans), wound feather bodies (tail barbs used as abdomens on many nymphs and dries), spey hackle (a decent heron or blue eared pheasant sub), soft hackle (good size range), dry tails (mayflies etc), wet tails (nymphs), paired quill wings (wets), wing cases (nymphs), wing biots (stonefly tails), dyed "ring feathers" sub for Indian crow, paired quill wings (wets), matuka wings (streamers), hen neck sub (many uses), salmon/steelhead veiling (when dyed), wet cheeks (Cains' River style streamers and other styles- often dyed), feather-sided bodies (tadpoles etc), antennae (dry and wet)

Squirrel Tail-Streamer tails, streamer wings, nymph tails, nymph legs, dry hairwings,

White-tailed jackrabbit-streamer tails, streamer bodies (palmered), matuka wings, dubbing 9nymphs and wets), wet wings (used in hairwing streamers for better wing action)
